FINANCIAL AID AND GI BILL BENEFITS

Military-connected students can receive financial aid and GI Bill educational benefits!

- GI Bill educational benefits are limited to times school is in session. Financial aid can help with expenses like housing, childcare, and other expenses that traditional students may not have.
- If you plan to pursue an advanced degree, you can be strategic about utilizing financial aid and preserving GI Bill for a future degree.
- FAFSA is based on prior-prior year income. If financial circumstances have changed, contact Office of Financial Aid (OFA) about a possible appeal for change in circumstances.
