Students who participate in CSU's Summer Session:

- Graduate at higher rates
- Take 7.4 credits on average over summer
- Are more likely to earn higher summer term grade point averages
- Aim to accelerate their academic progress, advance in their profession, or gain hands-on experience

Summer offers a unique opportunity to focus on one or few courses at a time, making it a great time to complete a challenging course, participate in experiential learning, or fulfill a prerequisite. By participating in Summer Session, students have the opportunity to graduate and earn earlier, and potentially reduce educational expenses.

During the summer session, students typically take less than 12 credits because of the condensed terms. Courses are offered in 4-, 8-, and 12-week terms and some varying lengths. The CSU Official and student have discussed the student's requirements and the credit compression. A full load of 12 credits may or may not be recommended for summer registration.
